

उत्तर प्रदेश राज्य ग्रामीण आजीविका मिशन के अन्तर्गत गठित स्वयं सहायता समूह के सदस्यों को शासन के 14 विभागों द्वारा संचालित 46 योजनाओं का लाभ पहुँच सके, इसके लिए उत्तर प्रदेश राज्य ग्रामीण आजीविका मिशन के अन्तर्गत चयनित समूह सखी को यूनीसेफ के सहयोग से प्रशिक्षित कर उपरोक्त लक्ष्य को प्राप्त करना प्रस्तावित है।






Multi-Sectoral Service Delivery & Social Security for One Million Families
Direct Benefit Transfer through SHGs
A Collaboration between Department of Rural Development, Government of UP and
UNICEF

Agreement

1. Background and Context:

- 1.1. UNICEF has a co-operation with Government of India and various Indian State Governments since post-independence. The institutional cooperation arrangement is titled as Basic Cooperation Agreement (BCA). The BCA was concluded between the Government of India and UNICEF on May 10th 1949 by virtue of which Country Program Action Plans (CPAP) are entered for every five years. The current CPAP 2018-2022 is underway and corresponding Rolling Work Plans (RWP) at UP is well in place, duly signed by 11 sector departments and with an overall approval by the Chief Secretary of Uttar Pradesh.
- 1.2. UNICEF's RWPs take into consideration community-level interventions in support of various Government schemes and programmes of which collaboration with Uttar Pradesh State Rural Livelihood Mission (UPSRLM) is an important part. This Agreement between UPSRLM and UNICEF defines the specific intervention and expected outcomes.
- 1.3. UPSRLM, a registered society under the control of Department of Rural Development (DoRD), Government of Uttar Pradesh (GoUP) works with rural poor households, especially with women, by forming their collectives in the form of Self-Help Groups (SHG). It conducts its programme primarily through collectivization of rural poor and institution development of rural poor to leverage around credit provisions and thereby generating and intensifying livelihood chain led by women in these families. This is not just a livelihood augmentation effort by the state; rather, a significant intervention for gender equalisation to supplement counter-poverty measure.
- 1.4. UPSRLM has facilitated SHGs to engage with anti-poverty schemes such as PDS, ICDS and BC *Sakhi* (financial inclusion) programmes. The proposed intervention envisages expansion of interventions to mobilise additional provisions for poor households under various schemes run by different government departments/ agencies and which are targeted for poverty alleviation and strengthening social safety net for the poor in rural Uttar Pradesh.
- 1.5. The State has trained and certified around 40,000 SHG members as Banking Correspondent (BC) program against the target of 58,000 under UPSRLM. They will ensure facilitating drawl of this amount in villages itself which is being extended under direct benefit transfers (DBT), which is worth Rs. 75,000 Cr. per year in State. This effort was appreciated by Hon'ble Prime Minister at Prayagraj Programme on December 21, 2021.





1.6. This Agreement will focus on mobilising the benefits of approximately 46 schemes under implementation by 14 different State departments to the members of SHGs. This will positively impact the outcomes of the livelihood initiatives being taken by UPSRLM contributing directly to SDGs. A moderate target of amount worth schemes mobilisation through this Multi-Sectoral and Social Security services for SHG will be Rs. One to three lakhs per annum.

1.7. The details of services envisaged for mobilisation under this Agreement is as follows:




2. Key features of UNICEF-DoRD collaboration: Objectives and deliverables

2.1. This collaboration would enable women-led mobilization of multi-sectoral services. The successful implementation will further amplify the benefits of SHG network and will pave the path for enhancing the role of SHG members in a wider development space. Hence, the name of the programme will be Women's Agency for Development Amplification (WADA). The *Samuh Sakhi* of UPSRLM will be selected and trained to undertake this new responsibility. The two crucial operational areas of work will be:

- (a) mobilising & facilitating absorption of multi-sectoral and social protection services,
- (b) anchoring technology-based functioning of SHGs & its' members.

2.2. The above two operational areas of Samuh Sakhis would also be complementary to the works of BC *Sakhis*, as it will lead to increased mobilisation of DBT to SHG members.

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
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4. Deliverables of collaboration

- 4.1. Approximately 7,223 Samuh Sakhis in 7223 Gram Panchayats in 36 Districts in the State will be identified and assigned the additional responsibilities of *WADA Sakhis* with their consent. These Sakhis will work for approximately 100000 SHGs existing in these GPs. These SHGs will have approximately 10,000,00 women as its member. This initiative intends to mobilise the benefits of 46 programmes on these One Million households. The details of Districts, Blocks, approximate number of Gram Panchayats, Samuh Sakhis, and Self Help Groups are at Annexure-1.
- 4.2. Mechanisms in place for mobilising multisectoral services in terms of DBTs realised by the SHG members in the selected 7223 Gram Panchayats.
- 4.3. A pilot for Samuh Sakhi/ WADA Sakhis model based on payment for services model to make it self sustainable will be also implemented. Implemented for piloting a priced-service model.
- 4.4. The community cadres of UPSRLM to be mapped on PFMS payment and honorarium payment be directly made in their bank accounts.

5. Expiration and Modification

- 5.1 This Agreement will be valid till 31 December 2022, which can be extended on mutual terms.
- 5.2 This Agreement may be modified only by mutual agreement of the Parties in writing, which shall be set out as an Annex hereto and will be treated as an integral part of this Agreement. Such Annexes shall be signed by the Parties and shall enter into effect as on the date of signature by all the Parties.
